


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INTRODUCTION

The annual progress report on the implementation of the Gender Action Plan, 2022–2025 is accompanied by a data companion and scorecard.

The data companion provides a progress update on the Gender Action Plan, 2022–2025 results matrix, which is aligned and structured in accordance with the results framework of the UNICEF Strategic Plan, 2022–2025 and consists of five Goal Areas as well as key performance indicators on organizational effectiveness and efficiency. Each of the five Goal Areas has three levels of indicators:

Impact

These indicators track changes in the lives of children and reflect UNICEF shared commitment to children.

Outcome

These indicators represent institutional and behavioural changes to which UNICEF contributes, in collaboration with partners.

Output

These indicators are most closely associated with the work and contributions of UNICEF. Baselines, results, milestones and targets are expressed as annual figures for most indicators. Where cumulative figures are shown, this is indicated.

While the data companion reports on the current status of gender-relevant Strategic Plan impact and outcome indicators, its main focus is on the output indicators. Details on methodology and sources are available in the Data companion and scorecard to the midterm review of the UNICEF Strategic Plan, 2022–2025 and annual report for 2023 of the Executive Director of UNICEF.

The indicators in this data companion are categorized across the dual gender-programming approach applied within UNICEF, namely gender priorities across the life course and adolescent girls' leadership, well-being, agency and voice.

In addition to programme indicators, the data companion provides an update on the progress made in relation to the UNICEF targets for organizational effectiveness and efficiency indicators related to gender equality. These indicators have been identified to track improvements in institutional effectiveness in order to achieve results on gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls. Furthermore, these benchmarks are aligned with the key areas of investment for UNICEF, namely, institutional readiness, accountability and integrating gender in programming so as to fully implement the Gender Action Plan.

Treatment data for adolescents living with HIV are not available for 2023 as there are not enough countries reporting data on adolescent treatment by age and sex that can be validated. In the data that are available, there are no gender differences in access to treatment. UNICEF is working to generate and analyse global and regional data on adolescent treatment in 2024.


Health workers receiving support through UNICEF programmes













Children benefiting from gender-responsive programmes for prevention of anaemia and malnutrition








Gender-responsive systems for learning and skills development



Percentage of countries with gender-responsive systems for learning and skills development









Gender in programme strategies and institutional systems

The Gender Action Plan implementation standard

The Gender Action Plan implementation standard (or GAP standard) measures whether a country office meets agreed organizational standards for the implementation of the Plan at the country level.


Building on the institutional standard for the Gender Action Plan, 2018–2021, the new GAP standard tracks nine criteria. They range from institutional readiness to accountability, programming and quality of gender results achieved (see figure below). These ambitious measures are helping to advance efforts to tackle systemic barriers and bottlenecks, and contribute to transformational change in the medium to long term.

The unit of analysis is the country office, which allows for regional and global aggregations. Each country receives a

score on each of the nine criteria as well as a final overall score. The data sources are mostly internal, corresponding to dedicated Strategic Plan indicators, or are based on extractions from proprietary databases (the enterprise resource planning software VISION, the Results Assessment Module (RAM), the capacity-building and training platform AGORA, and the emergency preparedness platform). All of these sources have established quality control mechanisms. In some instances, external data (i.e., Economic Dividends for Gender Equality, or EDGE certification) are used.

Global, regional and country performance are displayed on tailored gender dashboards that are available on the intranet, helping offices to monitor and improve their performance on the GAP standard.






Percentage of offices meeting the Gender Action Plan staffing guidance






Country offices that have management structures for the implementation of gender programming


Gender equality markers and tags are used in tandem for nuanced tracking of expenditure on outputs and activities that promote gender equality. This allows UNICEF to report on expenditure on gender-transformative programming in which the principal objective is promoting gender equality. UNICEF also reports on expenditure on gender-integrated programming that is making a significant or marginal contribution to gender equality, across development and humanitarian contexts. In 2023, an estimated 28.7 per cent of total expenditure contributed to gender-integration

activities across UNICEF programmes across Goal Areas, targeting women and girls in particular. Gendertransformative expenditure, on gender-tagged activities under programme outputs whose principal objective is advancing gender equality, was 10.6 per cent of total expenditure, representing an increase from 6.2 per cent in 2022. In emergency contexts, gender-transformative expenditure was at 13.6 per cent. UNICEF continues to strive to achieve a rate of 15 per cent gender-transformative expenditure by 2025.

Percentage of gender-transformative expenditure for 2023: (a) UNICEF overall



Percentage of gender-integrated expenditure for 2023





H.5.2 Percentage of country offices that conducted a Gender Programmatic Review in the current programme cycle (2023)



Percentage of country offices that have incorporated Gender Programmatic Review recommendations into all relevant programme planning documents (2023)




Percentage of country offices that conducted a rapid gender analysis in a humanitarian context (2023)

Percentage of country offices that conducted a rapid gender analysis in a humanitarian context, by type of analysis




Country offices that have engaged with gender priority actions on the emergency preparedness platform



Percentage of country offices that have implemented a minimum set of gender-based violence risk-mitigation actions



- (c) Gender analysis






Transformative child rights policies and programmes






Global and regional scores on the GAP standard






