






INTRODUCTION

Climate change is one of the biggest challenges we face. UNICEF works to protect you and your community from the impact of climate change, and partners with young activists calling for climate action.



INEQUALITY AND DISCRIMINATION

Children and young people everywhere suffer from racism, gender inequality and other forms of discrimination, including against those with disabilities. UNICEF supports movements for social justice to give children and young people the services they deserve.

58 per cent of you said you would like to learn about mental health from professionals, non-governmental or other organizations, rather than parents, teachers or friends.

Over 40 per cent of you think children and young people need the support of adults like parents and teachers to fight discrimination.

Only 47 per cent of you feel you have **the digital skills needed in life**.

We have to find ways to change this with policies around quotas and affirmative actions."




