## <u>Intervention by the Chair of the Standing Group of National</u> <u>Committees to Item 3: Annual report for 2021 of the Executive</u> <u>Director of UNICEF</u>

Mr President, Executive Director Russell, distinguished delegates, National Committee colleagues,

The magnitude of the multiple challenges faced by children this past year is daunting. Conflict, climate change, covid, poverty, inequality have slowed down progress in the achievement of the SDGs and posed a great threat to the rights of children everywhere. In the comprehensive report of the Executive Director, we can clearly see both the achievements and the negative impact these challenges had on our 5 goal areas, humanitarian and gender action plans.

But in the midst of it all, UNICEF has been a beacon of hope for every child. Thanks to UNICEF's global footprint and presence in over 190 countries and territories, 33 of them in the form of National Committees, we were able to unite and innovate like never before, offering our diversity, our expert skills and our services to our common cause.
