



Situation of Children in the World

Assessment of progress towards child-related SDG indicator targets




- Target met: the country has already achieved the global SDG targets

- No data available













Key Achievements in Cross-Cutting Programmes in 2022

Resilience

23 per cent of countries had a resilient education system that can respond to humanitarian crises.



18 countries had shock-responsive social protection systems.



12 per cent of offices met organizational standards for UNICEF Gender Action Plan

implementation.

Gender



Peacebuilding 16 countries integrated humanitariandevelopment-peace nexus approaches into WASH programming.



29 per cent of country offices met organizational benchmarks for contributions to social cohesion and peace.

4.5 million children with disabilities were reached

across different programmes in 142 countries.

69 countries implemented programmes to enhance climate and disaster resilience of children and promote environmental sustainability.



Disability



60 countries had at-scale programmes for strengthening the capacity of front-line workers for disability inclusion.

13 countries assessed the climate risks and articulated climate-resilient WASH services in key national documents related to climate change.



Organizational Effectiveness and Efficiency

2022 Progress

Progress rate was over 90 per cent in 8 out of 9 change strategies, with only the "Partnerships and Engagement" area at 77 per cent.

Select Results

60 per cent of country offices established or advanced community engagement and social and behaviour change standards for programming, and 37 per cent of country offices met organizational benchmarks for the accountability to affected populations.

A record \$7.4 billion in supplies and services procured in 2022. UNICEF leveraged its purchasing power in markets and product innovation to reduce barriers hindering access to supplies.

















2022 Progress

Progress rate was over 90 per cent in 4 out of 5 enablers, with only the "Agile and responsive business model" area at 77 per cent.

Select Results

Progress was made in overall gender parity, reaching 48.9 per cent women staff in 2022.

Organizational culture, diversity, equity and inclusion became more institutionalized, and progress was monitored on workplace culture.

About 40 per cent of offices met the organizational benchmark on psychological safety and trust.











Expenses and Revenue

Total revenue for 2022 was \$10.3 billion.

Public sector revenue: \$7.4 billion

Private sector revenue: \$2.7 billion

2022 regular resource revenue from the public sector decreased to \$524 million from \$762 million in 2021.

Revenue for humanitarian assistance at \$5.1 billion in 2022 was 60 per cent higher than 2021.

The humanitarian funding requirement increased to \$11.7 billion in 2022 from \$7.2 billion in 2021.

2022 JIU activities

3 JIU reports issued, with

- **20 recommendations** for action
 - 4 for Executive Board (EB)
 - 16 for Executive Director (ED)

UNICEF actions

Of the 20 recommendations,

- 18 accepted by UNICEF
 16 implemented in the same year
 2 in progress
- 2 not relevant or outside sole remit

UNICEF JIU status

For recommendations issued <u>prior</u> to 2022, of the 13 open recommendations,

- 8 implemented in 2022
- 5 remain in progress
