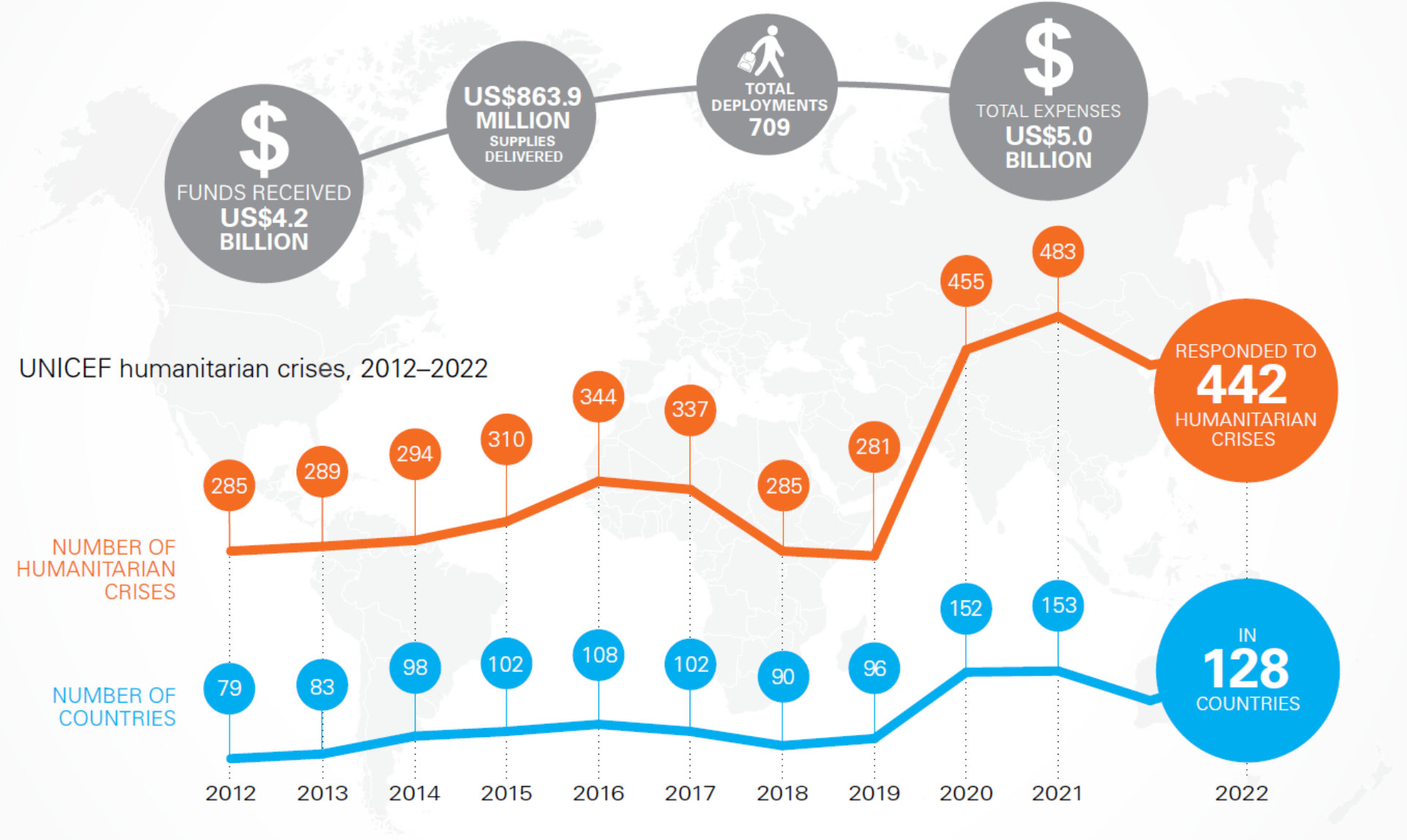

03. Overcoming challenges

- **Limited humanitarian access.** Capacity-building initiatives and development of *access strategies* to tackle extreme access constraints
- **Rapidly expanding needs.** Strategy on *accountability to affected populations, a more localized humanitarian response and optimization of warehouse operations*
- **Earmarking of funding.** *Advocacy and a call for quality and flexible funding* to enable UNICEF to be effective and equitable in its emergency response



04. Delivering better

- Applying a **"no-regrets"** approach to response to crises and rapidly expanding needs
- Strengthening **cluster leadership and accountability**, based on the recommendations of the CLARE II evaluation
- Fostering **gender equity and inclusion** in humanitarian preparedness, response and recovery actions
- **Enhancing partnerships** to maximize synergies and complementarities
- Programming to strengthen the **humanitarian–development–peace nexus** and **localization**



05. Looking ahead

- Addressing global humanitarian needs **sustainably**
- **Strengthening the resilience** of communities and health infrastructure to withstand climate hazards
- **Climate-adaptive** anticipatory action and preparedness efforts in humanitarian action
- **Global food and nutrition crisis** and multisectoral response **to famine prevention**
- Global strategic plan of action for **public health emergencies**
