Key takeaways

- Organizational priority and 2023
 Action Plan reflects broad collaboration
- Significant investments (\$40m)
- 87% of offices have PSEA plans; over 500 staff are engaged in the community of practice
- Improved monitoring and benchmarking on strategic objectives



A victim-centred approach for reporting, investigation and support services

- 49 million have information on reporting incidents
- 49 allegations registered in UN Secretary-General tracker
- Survivors of SEA receiving services including medical, legal and psychosocial support – programme reach of 880,000 women and girls



Prevention

- 99% of staff think approaches on PSEA are clear
- 95% of staff members completed PSEA training
- Having the "right" people on board through ClearCheck and performance management
- Joint UN assessment of implementing partners to build capacity
- Vendors and suppliers
