Achievements

- Well-established and strengthened **RC system**
- Increased **collaboration** at UNCT level
- **87%** UNICEF country offices delivered **jointly**
- Improved collective support to **national results** and **SDGs**
- **Cooperation Framework**: centre-piece of the reform

Opportunities

- **Dual accountability** and reporting model
- Further support to **human rights** mandate
- Leverage the reform to drive better **results for children**

Efficiency Agenda



- \$85 million savings in 2022 (cost-avoidance, cost savings, staff time reduction)
- 53% of UNICEF offices in Common Premises
- Common Back Office
- Advancing mutual recognition principle

Reporting on UNDS reform

- UNICEF reports annually on all elements of reform through its information note
- In response to GA resolution 76/4, DSG developed the checklist, in consultation with UNSDG entities
- NY-based agencies discussed a joint proposal for harmonized reporting on the UNDS reform checklist
- Next steps: Executive Board to consider the proposal and provide feedback
