	As regards the target levels for outcome 4 on p. 15 "By 2028, vulnerable children and adolescents enjoy human rights-based social protection programmes through equitable, efficient and transparent budget allocation and execution", we suggest to clarify that the target is supposed to be x% points above the baseline. Without that clarification, the target levels are not ambitious enough (as they are presented as percentage of percentage).	The targets outlined for indicator 1 under Outcome 4 (page 15) of the CPD are set as the baseline, quantified per each sector, increased by a definite percentage. Targets are set taking into consideration the limited fiscal space, high debt distress, double-digit inflation, and the underfinancing of the new National Development Plan 2023 – 2027, but also considering

	the central space of social sectors in national priorities and promising trends in support to the human capital pillar.
	The Government of The Gambia and UNICEF deem the set targets are both ambitious and attainable. UNICEF will continue to leverage strategic partnership and provide high standard technical assistance to accelerate public finance for children in the Gambia.
