UNICEF 2021 global data report reveals that an estimated 1 in every 10 children in the world – 240 million children – has a disability.

Compared with children without disabilities, children with disabilities are:

more likely to be **stunted**

more likely to have **never attended school**

more likely to experience severe corporal punishment
