

Results for children in times of COVID-19



More than 7.7 million children

have participated in skills development programmes



47.2 million children and caregivers accessed mental health

and psychosocial support



5 million children

with severe acute malnutrition were admitted for treatment globally



Over 130 million children were reached by cash transfer programmes



106 million people (including 58 million children)

reached with critical WASH services and supplies



5 million adolescents participated in civic engagement in humanitarian settings

17 million children vaccinated against measles



39.1 million people accessed safe water for drinking, cooking and personal hygiene

18% in 2020, to \$7,548 million

Regular resource revenue from the public sector decreased by

14%, to \$412 million (5% of total revenue)

Total humanitarian expense was at \$3,244 million

Public sector revenue = \$5,696 million

Private sector revenue = \$1,610 million
