I thank you, Mr. President, for giving me the floor. I warmly congratulate you

and other members of the Bureau on your election.

Madame Executive Director - I join others in warmly congratulating you on

your appointment. UNICEF is very special to Bangladesh; and we look

forward to continuing that special relations under your leadership. You will

have our full support.

**Madam Executive Director,** I thank you for your comprehensive overview on

UNICEF's priorities for children across the world amidst the ongoing global

challenges.

I have a few reflections and some specific questions:

First, we commend UNICEF's vital role in scaling up distribution of COVID

vaccines through COVAX, especially its efforts to ensure vaccines equality in

low-coverage African countries. However, we wish to reiterate that this new

imperative should not impact UNICEF's regular services in any manner.

UNICEF's signature programmes for children, especially the routine immunizationmust continue with the same scale and urgency.

We would like to know, how do you plan to mobilize respources for tacklingthe impacts of the pandemic on your regular services, while fulfilling your responsibilities with regard to distribution of COVID vaccines?

**Second**, the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on education is a generational catastrophe. The children in the countries of the global south are the hardest hit due to lack of access toonline education and distance learning paltforms.

Aganist this backdrop, the Secretary General's report 'Our Common Agenda' calls for a global "Digital Compact" with an ambitious target to "connect all people to the internet, including all schools".

How does UNICEF plan to scale up its successful initiatives such as GIGA to support this vision?

**Third**, as the Chair of Peacebuilding Commission for 2022, Bangladesh attaches high priority to the enhanced engagements of the PBC with Funds and Programs. We are aware of UNICEF's importantworkfor children in conflict affected contexts, which makes it one of the largest receipients of the PeacebuildingFund.

How can the PBC collaborate more with the UNICEF within its mandate tosupport UNICEF's work for children in the peacebuilding context?

**Finally,** how do you plan to ensure maximum synergies of UNICEF's Strategic Plan with national priorities to put childrenat the centerof national response and recovery efforts from the pandemic.
