

Evolution of attacks 2019, 2020, 2021 and 2022




- Continuous increase in conflict incidents since 2019.
- Increasing complexity (security management and access) due to overlap between armed groups' areas of influence.
- Expansion of armed groups who do not perceive UN and partners as neutral.
- Increased willingess to target humanitarian workers, assets and activities not perceive UN and partners as neutral.


