


CONFLICT DYNAMICS IN CENTRAL SAHEL

Attacks from 1 January 2021 to 30 December 2022, school closures and UNICEF presence


(Attack: Violence against civilians - all forms of violence except sexual violence - by an organised armed actor)



Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs)




Evolution of incidents from 2018 to 2022



- Continuous increase in conflict incidents since 2018.
- Increasing complexity (security management and access) due to overlap between armed groups' areas of influence.
- Expansion of armed groups who do not perceive UN and partners as neutral.
- Increased willingess to target humanitarian workers, assets and activities.

+20% of IDPs since December 2021


