
The Nutrition Cluster Situation Report offers a comprehensive analysis of the impact of the floods on the nutrition response, the current state of the nutrition response, significant obstacles impeding the expansion of the response in the areas impacted by the floods, and potential avenues for assistance in strengthening the nutrition response.

Key Update

- From 1st to 23rd November, Nutrition Cluster Partners screened a total 39,725 children aged 6-59 months for acute malnutrition. Of these, 8,610 (22%) and 4,058 (10%) children showed moderate and severe wasting, respectively. 80 (0.2%) children were identified with bilateral pitting odema and were transferred to respective nutrition centers for management.
- A total of 7,742 children were enrolled in the nutrition treatment centres. Of these, 4,087 Children were enrolled in the TSFP centres for moderate wasting treatment while 3,402 were enrolled into the OTP Centres for severe wasting management for wasting treatment, respectively. Consequently, 253 children with severe wasting with medical complications were admitted to the stabilization centers for treatment.
- A total of 13,864 pregnant and lactating women received individual counseling on appropriate IYCF and child care practices.
- Partners have scaled up screening activities across all flood-affected areas to ensure malnourished cases are identified early and referred to respective treatment centers.
